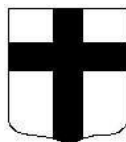

My dear People of WWW

My monthly appearance keeps me connected to the faith community that we have come to love and truly miss on Sundays. We are however grateful for the opportunity to get to know many more parishioners throughout the Diocese and worshipping with them is also a great joy and delight.

Remembering those who suffer:

Today and during this week we will remember all those who are displaced and those who need to seek for refuge, fleeing from their country of birth in search of a safer situation in which to live and work. Last year in my reflection I mentioned that there are people who leave their Country of birth by choice (like us), those who seek for better opportunities somewhere else, and those who have to flee under difficult circumstances to find 'sanctuary' somewhere else. Knowing the difficulty that people are experiencing, the loss of lives and children being affected in so many ways should compel us to show great hospitality and generosity to the stranger. Let us not only uphold people in our prayers but shower them with loving embrace so that they can experience newness and renewal in their own lives.

Working together:

I pray that we will make use of the opportunity to continue with our ministry outreach programme. I am aware that the date for Parish Council was the original date for our Ministry Development meeting but I hope that we will be able to get together soon to action some of our plans.

Parish Activities:

Towards the end of June following Synod, I am hoping that all people in Leadership positions within the Church here in WWW, would have complied Safe Ministry, Police and Working with Children Checks. There is still time to do this though the next Safe Church Workshop will only be towards the third week of November.
