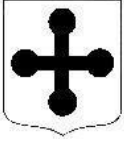

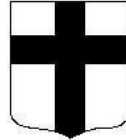

Random Notes from Parish Secretary

Fr Paul has been on study leave this week, undergoing an intensive time at Trinity College, I am sure most of us do not envy him, and Fr Clarence is as busy as two bees!

So I have been asked to fill the column – so here are some random thoughts!

I attended the **Diocesan Synod** on Friday and Saturday, as an observer, to hear the Bishop’s Charge to the Diocese, and to ensure that I keep up with all the new legislation that affects our parish. Many of you will have read the article in Friday’s Chronicle regarding the Bishop’s Charge, and most of the highlights were mentioned there. The General Synod legislation affects us all, with Safe Church practices, and we must comply.

The **Parish Administration Act** had amending legislation, the main thrust was that parish councillors and wardens be elected for a 3 year (instead of a 1 year) period, with a maximum of 2 terms (ie 6 years). It was also agreed that a committee be formed to completely re-write this Act to bring it in to a more modern and user friendly language.

Two motions encouraging the Bishop to start conversations regarding the blessing of same-sex civil marriages drew a number of

quite emotional speeches, resulting in the Bishop agreeing to start this conversation.

Now - **Parish Council** – at its meeting on Tuesday evening, it was agreed that on our 5th Sunday in July, (29th), will be the Bishop’s Soup Sunday. Fr Clarence (and others) have offered to make soup, there will be bread and sandwiches, and a figure of \$5 was suggested.

During that morning, our Synod Representatives, Suzie Don Leonard and Bill Gent will give a comprehensive report on Synod, so please mark this date in your diary to ensure that you are able to stay to hear the reports and enjoy the soup.

Fete planning has begun, so when you are pruning and dividing, please pot up a few cuttings and plants for the garden stall. We have agreed to have a “quality” clothing stall, so when you are sorting out your wardrobe, please keep this in mind.

Also items for the Trash’n’Treasure. And, if you have any brilliant ideas for the Fete, please let your Warden know, so that we can consider them.

Robyn and Warren are the Fete Convenors this year, and have suggested that we have a few minutes together after our soup and sandwich brunch, to consider any new ideas that come forward, all are welcome to stay and chat.
